NEWPORT.

Death of Miss Jessie Wadham.—Much sympathy is felt with Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Wadham in the death of their third daughter, Miss Edith Jessie Wadham, which sad event took place on Sunday last at Truro from peritonitis. The news came as a shock to the deceased's lady's many friends, who were not aware that some two months ago she had undergone a serious operation. She had gone to Cornwall for the benefit of her health and was staying with her sister, Miss Wadham, a trained nurse, who lovingly and skilfully tended her through her fatal illness, which came on suddenly on the Thursday prior to her death. A pleasing and talented vocalist, the late Miss Wadham was ever welcome on local concert platforms, and she was a valued member of the Philharmonic Society and, for some time, of the Carisbrooke Church Choir. She had also rendered valued service as a district visitor and in work of a charitable character, her bright and cheery disposition making her a favourite. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon. The first portion of the service was held at Carisbrooke Church, the Rev. A. H. C. Edlin impressively officiating. The chief mourners were Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Wadham (father and mother), Mrs. Belben (sister), Miss Wadham (sister), Messrs. Arthur, Sidney, Percy, and Stanley Wadham (brothers), Mrs. Burton, Miss Burton, and Mr. Frank Burton. Amongst those also attending were Mrs. Arthur Wadham, Mrs. Sidney Wadham, Mrs. Percy Wadham, and Mrs. Stanley Wadham (sisters-in-law), Mr. Harry Cushing, A.R.C.O. (conductor), and Mr. A. Gill-Martin (hon. secretary), representing the Newport Philharmonic Society, and Mr. E. J. Airs (hon. secretary of the Newport Orchestral Society). The service at the church commenced with the hymn "Peace, perfect peace", the choir being present. Mr. J. T. Read presided at the organ and played a "Funeral march" at the conclusion of the service. A large number of mourners also assembled at the graveside at Carisbrooke Cemetery, where the service was completed by the Rev. A. H. C. Edlin. There were a large number of beautiful floral tributes, those sending them including the employees at each of the Messrs. Wadham and Sons' establishments at Newport and Cowes. Mr. Quinton was the undertaker.
