

## **Elizabeth Warder**

**Isle of Wight Observer - 30 June 1866**

### **NEWPORT**

INQUESTS. – An inquest was held .... before E. F. Blake, esq., deputy coroner ... on Wednesday.... On the same morning, at 12o'clock, another inquest was held at Carisbrooke, at the house of Mr. Arthur Greenan, on the body of Elizabeth Warder, aged 3 years and 9 months, a child of the next-door neighbour, Fanny Warder, who died suddenly on the previous afternoon in the road at Bedford-place. The evidence went to show that deceased went into Newport during the funeral of her brother, which was 1 year and 6 months old, and was taken in a fit on returning home at the above place. Dr. Wilkins was sent for, and was immediately in attendance, and did all that was requisite, and went home for some medicine, but the child died before his return. He stated that death was occasioned by natural causes, and the jury returned verdict accordingly.
