ACCIDENT. – Mr. John L. Webb, the hon. sec. to the Newport Debating Society, has almost recovered from an accident which he met with a few days ago when walking down the footpath leading from the Castle grounds. The accident occurred at night, and was entirely owing to the unsafe and dangerous condition of the footpath, to which attention has before been called. How long is this frequently used oath to remain in this condition, when the expenditure of a few shillings would render it safe ? Through the unexpected of six or seven feet, Mr. Webb sustained a rather serious sprain of the right knee.
