DEATH OF MR. GEORGE WEBBER. – The death occurred on Wednesday, at his residence, Trafalgar-road, after a week's illness, of an esteemed resident, Mr. George Webber, aged 82, who had been living in retirement for ten years. Many years ago he was in the employ of Mr. Broadley Way, grocer, &c., of High-street and St. Thomas's-square, and afterwards for very many years in that of Messrs. Jordan and Stanley in St. James's-square. His happy and obliging disposition won him hosts of friends, who will regret to hear of his death. In early days he served in the Royal Horse Artillery, and on one occasion covered the distance from Aldershot to Norwich by road. He was a strong Unionist, and was a member of the Foresters. He was passionately fond of flowers, and his well-kept little garden was a source of much enjoyment to him and passers-by. Much sympathy is felt for his widow.
