Cinema Commissionaire's Death. – The death occurred suddenly at his home at 73 Ash Road on Tuesday week of Mr. James Westmore, late of 29 Highfield Road. He was 63 and had been a member of the British Legion since the 1914-18 war. For many years he was employed at the Folly Works, and later by Messrs. J. S. White & Co. as a works policeman. He subsequently became commissionaire at the Grand Cinema and remained there until ill-health forced him to retire eight months ago. He leaves a widow, with whom sympathy is felt. The funeral took place at the Wesleyan Methodist Church on Saturday and the interment followed at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The Rev. C. Cardy officiated. The mourners were Mrs. J. Westmore (widow), Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Westmore and Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Westmore (sons and daughters-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. G. G. Hayes (son-in-law and daughter), the Misses H. and R. Westmore (grand-daughters), Mrs. E. Elkins (sister), Mrs. E. Westmore and Mrs. S. Pierce (sisters-in-law), and Messrs. H. and B. Westmore (nephews). Messrs. O. C.
