The Late Mr. E. F. Williams.- The death occurred on Tuesday at the house in which he was born, of Mr. Ernest Frederick Williams, aged 76, of 43 Melbourne Street. A son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Williams, Mr. Williams was a member of a family of 18, and since his wife's death 36 years ago had lived with his sister, Miss B. A. Williams, at their old home. He served an apprenticeship with the late Mr. R. Bird Cheverton, but later established his own business as a motorsmith in East Street, where he worked until poor health caused his retirement at the age of 57. He was responsible for the repairs on Princess Beatrice's carriage when she was in residence on the Island. Before his retirement Mr. Williams was an enthusiastic supporter of the Football Club and a member of the committee. During the first world war his work was considered of national importance and during the 1939-45 war he shared the fire watching duty. Mr. Williams is survived by two married daughters, Mrs. D. Piper and Mrs. R. Canning. The funeral will take place to-day, when a service will be held at the Carisbrooke Cemetery Chapel, by special request of Mr. Williams.
