The Late Mr. E. Wragg.—The funeral took place on Tuesday at Carisbrooke Cemetery of Mr. Edward Wragg, whose death, at the age of 61, occurred the previous Wednesday at 5 Catherine Terrace. A native of Birmingham, Mr. Wragg came here during the 1914-1918 war, when he was serving with the Royal Warwickshire Regiment, and was stationed at Albany Barracks. He attained the rank of sergeant, and saw service in Mesopotamia. On démobilisation in 1920 he took up employment as a general labourer. At the outbreak of the last war he rejoined the Army, and served in the Royal Hampshire Regiment, but was given a medical discharge in 1942. Since that time, although he was never in very good health, Mr. Wragg continued to take an active interest in the local branch of the British Legion. The Rev. S. F. Cooper conducted the service, and the mourners were Mrs. Wragg (widow), Messrs. E. J., A., and R. Wragg (sons), Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Edmonds and the Misses Elsie and Ethel Wragg (son-in-law and daughters), Mrs. D. Newhouse (sister), Master R. Newhouse (nephew), and Mesdames R. Woodmore, A. Richards, N. Pidgley, and B. Bloomfield (sisters-in-law). Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
