Death of Mr. G. M. Barton.- The death took place on Friday week at St. Mary's Hospital of Mr. George Morris Barton, aged 53, of 6 Pan Close. A native of the town, he had for the past few months employed by Mew's Block Co., Ltd. and for several years previously by Wall Brothers (Civil Engineers), Ltd. From 1941 onwards he served in a light anti-aircraft regiment, first with the 8th Army in North Africa and later in the D-day landings in Normandy. For 18 years he was a member of the Wight Rodeo. The funeral service at Carisbrooke Cemetery Chapel on Wednesday was conducted by the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley. The mourners were Mrs. N. Barton (widow), Mr. M. G.
