Death of Mrs. G. W. Blee.—The death took place on Tuesday, the eve of her diamond wedding anniversary, of Mrs. Alice Mary Blee, aged 78, wife of Mr. G. W. Blee, of Fairies, Watergate Road. Mrs. Blee had a severe heart attack about three weeks ago, and was being cared for at the home of her son and daughter-in-law (Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Blee), at 79 Whitepit Lane, where her death took place, A member of a well known Carisbrooke family, Mrs. Blee was the daughter of the late Mr. John Lockhart, and before her marriage was a dressmaker working with her mother in Carisbrooke Road. After her marriage on October 3rd, 1896, she and her husband, who is a retired joiner and, at 85, one of the oldest surviving members of the I.W. Rifle Volunteers and Territorials, in which he was a company sergeant-major, resided for many years at Seymour House, Fairlee Road. Mrs. Blee was a member of the women's section of the British Legion. She leaves a husband, six sons, and a daughter. The funeral takes place to-day. The service at St. John's Church at 2 p.m. will be followed by interment at Newport Cemetery.
