DEATH OF MR. J. H. CAVE. – The death took place after a long illness on Friday week of Mr. Henry Cave, 75, of 3 Pyle-street, a member of the well-known local family of nurserymen. He was the third son of the late Mr. Edward Cave, of the Newport Nurseries. After being trained at the nurseries he was for many years head gardener to the late Mr. William Spindler, of Old Park, Niton Undercliff, and was responsible for laying out the beautiful grounds of this residence, now spoiled by the succession of landslides which have occurred in that neighbourhood. He was therefore well-known in the Niton and Whitwell districts. Some 20 years ago he returned to the Newport nurseries, and had been employed there since, until advancing years caused his retirement. He leaves a widow, three sons, and a daughter. The funeral took place on Monday, a service being held at the Parish Church, and the interment at Newport Cemetery. The Vicar (Canon C. H. Thompson) officiated, and the chief mourners were Messrs. T. Cave (son), C. H. and A. Cave (brothers), and C. Cave (nephew).
