FIRST FEMALE ODDFELLOW'S DEATH. – The Lady Adela Cochrane Lodge of Female Oddfellows lost their first member by the death last Saturday, when a much respected young member passed away in the person of Miss Annie Clarke, aged 18, a daughter of Mr. C. Clarke, an employee at the Royal Brewery. The deceased was ill only a very short time, and much sympathy is felt for the bereaved parents. The funeral took place at Newport Cemetery on Wednesday afternoon, in the presence of several of the officers and members of the Female Lodge of Oddfellows and scholars and teachers of the Wesleyan Sunday-school, of which deceased was formerly a member. The first portion of the service took place at the Wesleyan Church, the Rev. G. Southall officiating. The principle Oddfellows attending were Sisters Hurry, N.G., Martin, V.G., and Westmore (secretary), and Bro. J. B. Alderslade (a trustee of the Lady Adela Cochrane Lodge), with the Lodge surgeon (Dr. C. J. Thompson). At the graveside Sis. Westmore read the Oddfellows' funeral service. The floral tributes included one from the female Oddfellows.
