DEATH OF MRS. H. COOKE. – The death took place at her home in Lugley-street on Wednesday last, after an illness of six weeks, of Mrs. Henrietta Cooke, at the advanced age of 85 years. Mrs. Cooke, who had spent the whole of her life in Newport, had enjoyed excellent health until the last three or four years, and was well known and respected by a wide circle of friends. She was an old and valued member of the St. John's Mothers' Meeting. Her husband, whose death took place 35 years ago, was for many years a respected servant of W. B. Mew, Langton, and Co., where two of her sons, Messrs. C. and A. Cooke, are still employed. The interment took place on Saturday at the Newport Cemetery, the service being conducted by the Rev. W. H. Mackinnon (vicar of St. John's). The mourners were Messrs. C., A., W., and J. Cooke (sons), Messrs. F. Salter and B. Priddle (sons-in-law), Messrs. F. Salter and F. Priddle (grandsons), Mr. R. Taylor, Mr. J. Scovell, and Mr. T. White. ... The arrangement were carried out by Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son.
