THE LATE REV. W. DEAN.- On Friday afternoon, the 25th, the mortal remains of the late Rev. W. Dean were interred at the churchyard. Previous to being consigned to its last resting- place the body was taken to the Baptist Chapel, where an impressive service was held, conducted by the Rev John Collins, of Lymington, a personal friend of the deceased. The speaker made touching reference to the life of Mr. Dean and his faithful discharge of duty, ending a life of four-score years without a cloud - a workman that needed not to be ashamed, whose record was treasured on high by a faithful God. Ms. Dean, the widow, Mrs. Gilbert (daughter), Mr. Gilbert (son-in-law), and Mr. J. A. Long (nephew), with a number of friends, including Mr. and Mrs. R. Page, sen., Mrs. Lowe, Mrs. Rice, Mr. and Mrs. Kelsey, Mrs. G. Kelsey, Mrs. Long, Captain John Griffiths, Mr. Radford, Mr. Hill, Mr. A. Fryer, Mr. Hodge, Mr. Thomas Cotton, and others attended. The funeral arrangements were carried out by Mr. James Griffiths. On the following Sunday special reference was made in the evening to the useful life of the late Mr. Dean. Mr. Hill occupied the pulpit at the Baptist Chapel, taking as his text 2 Timothy iv. 6,7,8. Addressing a good congregation, the preacher spoke solemnly on the reality and the uncertainty of life and its lessons, pointing out the great necessity of being ready for the call that will surely come to old and young alike, without respect of persons.
