DEATH OF MRS. W. DEEMING.--The local Labour party has lost a keen supporter and valued worker by the death on Sunday at 13 Lugley-street of Mrs. Elsie Deeming, wife of Mr. William Deeming. Mr. Deeming has been the caretaker of the Labour party's headquarters in Lugley-street since the branch was formed some years ago. Mrs. Deeming had been actively connected with the work, especially in the women's section, and her death at the early age of 41 will be greatly regretted by a large circle of friends. Sincere sympathy is felt with Mr. Deeming and his young son in their irreparable loss. Mrs. Deeming was a native of the borough. The funeral took place on Thursday, the service being held in the Victoria Methodist Church, where the Rev. J. Matthewman officiated. The mourners were Mr. W. Deeming (husband), Master A. Deeming (son), Messrs. J., B., and H. Fallick (brothers), Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Woodford (sisters), Mrs. W. Deeming (mother-in-law), and Mesdames B. and H. Fallick (sisters-in-law). The I.W. branch of the Old Comrades of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment was represented by Messrs. L. V. Biffen, H. Parker, and J. Smith. The interment followed at Newport Cemetery and the choice floral tributes included wreaths from the Newport Labour party; the women's section of the Labour party; the Women's Co-operative Guild; National Union of Railwaymen; the Victoria Methodist Church Sisterhood; the Women's Meeting at Holyrood-hall; Messrs. F. W. Woolworth's Social Club; the staff at Messrs. Duke Bros.; I.W. branch of the Old Comrades of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment; and the Transport Women's Guild. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.---Mr. Deeming and brothers and sisters wish to thank all who sent messages of sympathy in their bereavement and for floral tributes sent.
