Death of Mrs. L. E. Dore. – The death took place on Thursday after a lengthy illness of Mrs. Alice Beatrice Dore, of 4 High Street, widow of Mr. Leslie E. Dore, who died in January last. Mrs. Dore, a native of Newport, was well-known as a teacher, notably at the Infants' department of the C.E. School, and also at other schools in the distrit, latterly at Westmont. During the war she was in charge of the local nursery school. She married in 1933, and was a life-long member of the choir of St. Paul's Barton, Church, where her husband was organist and choirmaster for 37 years. She also worked hard for church activities, including the Sunday-school and the C.M.S. Mrs. Dore took a keen interest in National Savings and was prominent in street group work during the war. The Late Mrs. L. E. Dore. – The funeral service was held at St. Paul's Church, Barton, on Monday for Mrs. Alice Beatrice Dore, of 4 High Street, widow of Mr. L. E. Dore, who was organist and choirmaster of the church for 37 years. There was a large congregation representative of the many parish and other activities with which Mrs. Dore had been associated, including the National Savings movement. The Vicar (the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley) paid warm tribute to Mrs. Dore's life-long work for the church, in which her whole interest had been centred. He also specially referred to her devoted work for the C.M.S., and said that she not only sang in the choir, but also greatly helped her husband in all the work connected with his office. The lesson was read by the Rev. W. J. Norman (area secretary of the C.M.S.). The robed choir met the cortege at the churchyard gate and formed a guard of honour at the close of the service. Mrs. K. M. Plucknett was at the organ. The mourners were Mr. C. Dodsworth (brother), Mr. and Mrs. A. Perrett (brother-in-law and sister), Miss E. Dodsworth (sister), Mr. G. Dore and Mr. and Mrs. R. Dore (brothers-in-law and sister-in-law), Mr. L. Perrett and Mr. and Mrs. C. Simpson (nephews and niece), Mr. and Mrs. J. Wright (cousins), Mr. J. Darneley and Mr. R. Blake.
