Death of Warburton's Hotel Host.—The death took place rather unexpectedly on Saturday, although he had been in failing health for some time, of Mr. Leslie Thomas Green, who had been the esteemed proprietor of Warburton's Hotel for 12 years, and prior to that he and Mrs. Green conducted the Vine Hotel, St. Helens.
