DEATH OF MRS. M. St. C. HEAL

The death occurred on Monday at St. Mary's Hospital of Mrs. Minnie St. Clair Heal, aged 77, of 16 Fairlee Road. A native of the town, Mrs. Heal met her husband Mr. E.F. Heal, at an I.W. Agricultural Show, and they were married in St John's Church by the Rev. J.R. Edwards on October 10th, 1905. For many years she was a member of the Pyle Street Methodist Church. While her health permitted she regularly attended services and took part in the activities of various church organisations. Mr. Heal is the third son of the late Mr. Charles Heal, for many years blacksmith at Calbourne.

The funeral took place on Thursday at the Pyle Street Methodist Church. During the service, conducted by the Rev. C Cardy (minister), the hymns "In heavenly love abiding" and "How sweet the name of Jesus sounds" were sung. The mourners were Mr. E.F. Heal (husband), Mr. and Mrs. A.G. Snow and Mr. and Mrs. L.V. Rolf (sons-in-law and daughters), Mr. and Mrs. E.W. and Mr. and Mrs. F. Barton and Mrs. E. Marsh (brothers and sisters-in-law), Mr. & Mrs. W. Hayles and Messrs. H.J. and W. Heal (brothers-in-law and sister), Messrs. C. Heal, A. Saunders, and C.G. Brown, Mrs. R.H. Allen, and Mr. and Mrs. C. Greening (nephews and nieces), and Miss G. Snow (grand-daughter). Mrs. A.F. Heal (daughter-in-law) was unable to attend owing to the illness of her mother.
