**Death of Mrs. Hooton.-** The death occurred at Roach's Hotel, Quay-street, on Tuesday, of Mrs. Annie Elizabeth Hooton, aged 60, widow of Mr. Frederick J. Hooton, of the Royal Fusiliers, a lady well known as the extremely able and highly esteemed proprietress of the hotel for the last 21 years: some 10 years at its present address at 41 Quay-street, and formerly at premises in St. James's-square, where it had been carried on for many years. Mrs. Hooton, whose maiden name was Turner, an old Colwell family, had been in impaired health for some four years, and seriously ill for a year. Much sympathy is felt with her daughter and son-in-law (Mr. and Mrs. M. C. Jolliffe) in their bereavement. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday), a service being held in the Parish Church and the interment at Newport Cemetery.
