The Late Mr. E. J. S. Hurry.- The death occurred on Tuesday of Mr. Edwin James Silvester Hurry, aged 79, of 14 Crocker Street. Mr. Hurry was born in the town and was employed for the whole of his working life, except for war service, as a moulder by Messrs. W. Hurst and Son. He joined the old borough volunteer Fire Brigade as a call-boy at the age of 16 and by 1939 had become third officer. During the 1914-18 war he was a sick berth attendant in the Royal Navy and in the last war he served in the National Fire Service here and at Ryde, Shanklin and Freshwater. Mr. Hurry was an old member of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Odd Fellows and a Past Noble Grand. He had also been a member of the St. John Ambulance Brigade. The funeral service was conducted by The Rev. F. J. Fuller at the Parish Church, where Mr. Hurry was a regular worshipper and, in his young days, a member of the choir. The mourners included Mrs. Hurry (widow), Mr. W. J. Hurry (son), Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Carter (son-in-law and daughter), Mrs. B. Wells (grand-daughter), Miss P. Woodley (sister-in-law), Messrs. R. and O. R. Woodley (brothers-in-law), Mrs. F. Langdon (niece) and Miss G. Turner.
