### NEWPORT

**DEATH OF MR. W. D. HUTTON.** – We regret to record the death, after a painful illness, which commenced some years ago when he accidentally fell and broke his ankle, of Mr. William Daniel Hutton, of Carnforth, Medina-avenue, at the age of 73. Deceased, who came to the town nearly 40 years ago as the agent for a popular commercial commodity, became well known and highly esteemed as an ideal hon. secretary for the Newport Cricket Club in its palmy days, as a prominent Freemason, and as a talented and popular reciter, some of Kipling's famous works being among his favourites. He was always ready to give his services for charitable and deserving objects, and his recital of Kipling's "Absent-minded beggar" was ever welcome and effective. In appreciation of his splendid services to the Cricket Club he was presented in 1896 with a gold watch and chain and an illuminated address. He was a valued member of the Albany (Newport) and Medina (Cowes) Lodges of Freemasons, and also of the Albany and Asher Barfield Chapters of the Royal Arch Masons, having been the secretary of the former for 17 years. Wit and humour, combined with a genial disposition, made him an ever welcome companion. He was for many years a member of the Literary Society and keenly interested in the literary associations of Newport and the Island and he was one of those who secured the inscribing on the memorial of John Hamilton Reynolds, in the Church-litten burial-ground, of "A friend of Keats." Much sympathy is felt for the widow in her bereavement. The funeral takes place to-day (Saturday) at the Parish Church at 2 o'clock, and at Newport Cemetery.
