THE LATE DR. T. M. KENDALL. – The funeral of Dr. T. M. Kendall, who died last week at the age of 73 at West End-terrace, took place on Monday, the first part of the service being at the Parish Church and the interment at Newport Cemetery, where deceased's wife was laid to rest about three years ago. As a tribute to deceased's service in the R.A.M.C. during the war the coffin was borne on a gun carriage with a party of the 43rd Light Infantry in attendance, and buglers from that regiment sounded the "Last Post" at the graveside. The Rev. Canon C. H. Thompson (vicar of Newport) officiated, assisted by the Rev. A. Wardroper (formerly vicar of Shalfleet). The personal mourners were Mrs. C. H. Colenutt, Mrs. Cheek, Miss Cheek, and Mrs. Kearley, and there were also present the Rev. H. S. Footman, R.D. (vicar of Carisbrooke), Mr. E. F. Wray, Mr. A. Alabone, Mr. C. A. Good, Mr. J. W. Marshall, Mr. S. O. Feben, Mr. C. H. Cave, Mr. R. H. Archer, Mesdames S. O. Feben, E. Sharp, W. Cooke, R. H. Archer, and H. Jacobs, and Miss Osborne.

DOCTOR'S DEATH.

DR. THEODORE MAILLER-KENDALL, whose death occurred recently at Newport, Isle of Wight, at the age of 74 years. He was a well-know practitioner in Sydney many years ago. For 12 years he was medical officer to the Water Board. In 1904 he proceeded to Launceston, and later to England. During the war Dr. Mailler-Kendall was in charge of the hospital ship St. Andrew, which carried wounded soldiers from France to England.
