The deceased lady was the widow of Mr. Henry Mew, who in his time played a prominent part in the public life of Newport. He was for many years a member of the Corporation, filling on more than one occasion the highest civic position, and in performing the social and hospitable functions attaching to the more personal side of the Mayoralty he had the advantage of the ever ready and always pleasing co-operation of the kindly lady who has just gone from amongst us. Mrs. Henry Mew was a daughter of the late Mr. Andrew Toward, for so many years Her Majesty's steward at Osborne, trusted and beloved, and at the time of her husband's death she received a most gracious message of sympathy from the Queen. The funeral took place on Tuesday last, when the remains of the deceased lady were placed in the same grave at Newport Cemetery where rest all that was mortal of her husband, the service being performed by the Vicar, the Rev. Clement Smith. The chief mourner was her sister, Miss Toward, who has the sincere sympathy of all her friends in this time of her bereavement. Amongst the friends attending the funeral were Mr. Richard Mew, Mr. Percy Mew, Mrs. J. L. Moore, Mr. W. T. Way Buckell, Mr. Roach Pittis, J.P., and Dr. Foster, J.P.
