OBITUARY. – Much sympathy is felt for Mr. and Mrs. G. O. Morris, of Great Pan Farm, in the death, after a very short illness, of their eldest son, Harold Oliver, in his 16th year. The deceased lad was employed at Mr. G. B. Purkis's tailoring and outfitting establishment in St. Thomas's square. He was formerly a scholar at the National-schools, where he won the watch presented by Lieut. Mackenzie Rogan for good conduct, and latterly at the Newport Secondary-school. He was a member of the United Methodist Sunday-school, and had also sung in the church choir. The funeral took place amidst many signs of sympathy on Thursday afternoon. A service was first held in the United Methodist Church, the Rev. P. Cudmore officiating. The mourners were Mr. G.
