The Late Mr. F. J. Morrison. - The death occurred at Whitecroft Hospital on Thursday week of Mr. Frederick John Morrison, of 61 Clarence Road. He was a native of the town and worked for MacFisheries for 35 years until his retirement from the management of the shop in St. Thomas's Square a short time ago. During the first world war he served in the Royal Navy, and in the last war in the Special Constabulary, continuing until about two years ago, when his health failed. He was a member of the Conservative Club. He is survived by his wife, four sons (all of whom are serving in the Army), and a daughter. The funeral took place at Newport Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley officiating. The family mourners were Mrs. F. J. Morrison (widow), Sergt. F. Morrison, R.E.M.E., W.O.1 A. Morrison, R.A.O.C., and Lce.-Corpl. K. Morrison, R.A.S.C. (sons), Miss J. Morrison (daughter), ex-Police Supt. A Morrison (brother), Mrs. H. Moore (sister), Mr. H. Dunford (brother-in-law), and Mr. K. Moore (nephew), Major J. Morrison, R.A.O.C. (son) was unable to attend. A detachment of the local regular and special constabulary, representatives of MacFisheries, and friends from other businesses in the town also attended. The floral tributes included those from the police, the directors of MacFisheries, and the local branch managers. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
