

**Frederick Payne**

**Hampshire Regt. Veteran's Death.**- The death occurred on Wednesday week, at his residence, 44 Victoria-road, of Mr. Frederick (Frank) Payne, aged 70. Mr. Payne served with the Hampshire Regiment on the North-west Frontier and in the South African and 1914-18 wars. He was a member of the South African War Veterans' Association and of the British Legion. The funeral service was on Monday in St. Paul's Church, the Vicar of Newport (Canon W. B. Hogg) officiating in the absence of the vicar (the Rev. H. G. Kelsey). The mourners were the widow and Mr. and Mrs. F. Weeks, Mr. and Mrs. H. House, and Mrs. F. Dominey (cousins). Others present were Mr. H. J. Mathews, and the Misses A. M. Cogger & A. Gull. Mrs. Bound represented the St. Paul's Mothers' Union and Mr. E. F. Millgate represented the British Legion. A guard of honour, through which the coffin was borne draped with the Union Jack, was formed by the following members of the South African War Veterans' Association: Messrs H. Godwin (president), W. Ferguson (hon. secretary and standard bearer), G. Greenham, R. T. Lawn, E. Capelhorn, W. A. Oxley, A. Hefford, E. J. Willis, and Everett. The floral tributes included those from the South African Veterans' Association and the British Legion. The interment was at St. Paul's cemetery. The arrangements were made by Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son.
