Well Known Tradesman`s Death.---The death took place at his residence 157 High-street, on Saturday, of Mr. Frederick Edward Perkins, aged 77, who had been in business as a baker and grocer at that address throughout his working life. He had been in ill-health for the last 10 years, but prior to that made his bread delivery rounds daily, and was held in the highest esteem for his cheery, kindly ways. He leaves a widow and two sons. The funeral was on Thursday, a service being held in the Victoria Methodist Church, the Rev. H. M. Jackson officiating, and the interment in Newport Cemetery.
