**POLICE INSPECTOR'S BEREAVEMENT.** --- Much sympathy is felt with Insp. John Salter, chief clerk of the I.W. County Constabulary, in the death, on Sunday, of his wife, Mrs. Kate Salter, at the age of 47. The deceased had been in failing health for some months, but the end came quite unexpectedly except to intimate friends. The late Mrs. Salter, who bore her illness with exemplary fortitude and unfailing spirit, was held in warm regard by a wide circle of friends in the districts in which her husband has been stationed, particularly at St. Paul's, Barton, where, whilst her health permitted, she rendered active and very valued help in connection with bazaar and other efforts promoted by the St. Paul's, Barton, Brotherhood, of which her husband has been registrar and hon. treasurer since its inception. The funeral took place on Thursday, the first part of the service being at St. Paul's, Barton, and the interment at Newport Cemetery, in the presence of the Chief Constable and officers, men of the County Constabulary, as well as some ex-officers, members of St. Paul's Brotherhood, and many other parishioners. The Rev. Miles Atkinson (vicar and president of the Brotherhood) officiated, assisted by the first President of the Brotherhood, the Rev. Charles Collis (rector of Freemantle), who came over specially from the mainland. The personal mourners were Insp. J. Salter (husband), Miss A. Salter (daughter), Sergt. J. Mew (brother) and Mrs. Mew (sister-in-law), Miss A. Mew (sister), Mrs. C. Morgan (sister) and Mr. C. Morgan (brother-in-law), Mr. E. C. Salter (father-in-law), Mrs. C. Salter and Mrs. T. Salter (sisters-in-law), Mrs. J. Morris (aunt), Miss Mabel Morris, and Miss M. Bashford. Then followed the members of the Constabulary, with Capt. H. Adams-Connor, M.V.O., D.L. (Chief Constable), Supt. J. H. Gallaway (Deputy Chief Constable), Insps. J. Bignell, H. Hawkins, and H. Sibbeck, Ex-Insp. T. Cass, Sergts. Hutchin, Shotter, and Shannon, and a number of constables, Station-Sergt. Walter Evans, Sergt. O. Sibbeck, and Constables F. Bungay and A. Gamble acting as bearers. There were also present Ex-Supt. William Ayres (Cowes), Ex-Sergt. T. Spanner and Mrs. Spanner, Mrs. T. Cass, Mrs. H. Sibbeck and Miss Sibbeck, Major Henry J. Way (vicar's warden) and Mrs. Way, Mr. and Mrs. W. Ouseley, Mr. and Mrs. W. Bishop, Mrs. W. H. Dyer, Mr. and Mrs. Morris, Messrs.

T. Brown, H. Harding, H. Allen (hon. sec. of the Brotherhood), Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Dore, Mrs. and Miss Leigh, Miss Atkinson, Miss Osborn, Mrs. Drudge, Mrs. Masters, Mrs. Croton, Miss Pragnell, Mrs. Willis, Mrs. Warne, and many others. The Vicar read the opening sentences, the Rev. C. Collis read the lesson and the other part of the service in the church, where the hymns "Jesu, Lover of my soul," and "On the Resurrection morning" were sung. Mr. S. W. Ibbotson presided at the organ and feelingly played funeral selections whilst the congregation were assembling and Chopin's "Marche funebre" at the close. The service at the graveside was concluded by the Vicar. There were a large number of beautiful floral tributes.

Mr. O. Hamilton carried out the funeral arrangements.-----Mr. Salter and family desire to return heartfelt thanks for kind inquiries and expressions of sympathy with them in their heavy bereavement.
