#### NEWPORT.

**WELL-KNOWN FORESTER'S DEATH.** – We regret to record the death, which took place on Friday night last week, at the age of 54, after a lingering illness, of Mr. John Stubbs, a trustee for some years of Court Island Foresters and the juvenile branch, and a very valued member of the Friendly Societies' Fate Committee. He had served Court Island Foresters well in the different offices, having been the Chief Ranger of the Court on the occasion of the celebration of the jubilee. He was a member of the Conservative Club and of the St. Thomas's Men's Bible Class. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon, the first part of the service being at St. Thomas's Church, and the interment at Newport Cemetery, the Rev. Miles Atkinson officiating. The mourners included deceased's five sons, Mr. A. Stubbs (brother), and Messrs. H. Gray, J. Harvey, W. Payne, S. Ballard, W. Wearn, and F. Freemantle, Bros. G. Jones, P.C.R., C. Eldridge, P.C.R. (trustee), A. J. Williams, P.C.R. (treasurer), and H. Way, P.C.R., acted as bearers, and other Foresters present included Bros. F. Midlane, P.C.R. (District secretary), E. J. Smith, P.C.R. (trustee), F. Spanner (Court secretary), W. H. Dyer (chairman of Juvenile Society), E. J. Mills, P.C.R., R. Mytton, P.C.R., and others, including Messrs. H. and F. Damp (builders and undertakers), for whom deceased worked for many years, and a number of his fellow employees from that firm. The floral tributes included an exquisite wreath from the Past Chief Rangers of Court Island Foresters. – Mrs. Stubbs and family wish to thank all friends for kind inquires and sympathy, and also for flowers sent.
