Death of Mrs. A. Teather. – The death took place on Friday week, at her residence, The Prince of Wales, South-street, of Mrs. Ann Teather, aged 61, widow of Mr. R. M. Teather. Mrs. Teather had been the licensee of the Prince of Wales for 30 years, and the business will now be taken over by her daughter, Miss D. Teather. She was the last surviving daughter of the late Joseph and Mrs. Booth, of Cordington, Notts. The deceased leaves two sons and two daughters; one of the sons is serving in Normandy.

The funeral took place on Tuesday in St. Thomas' Church. The Rev. L. U. Smith, C.F., officiated. The mourners were Miss D. Teather and Mrs. S. Smith (daughters), Messrs. R. Teather (son) and S.
