THE FUNERAL - of Mr. Thomas Glen-alvon Tilley, eldest son of Mr. B. W. Tilley, took place on Monday last at the Cemetery at Falkenstein, near Frankfort, where his death occurred on the previous Thursday at the age of 20. Mr. and Mrs. Tilley and Mr. Leonard Jordan were the mourners, and the funeral ceremony was performed by the Church of England clergyman from Frankfort. It is a lovely spot where our lamented young townsman has his last resting place. – Mr. and Mrs. B. W. Tilley and family return sincere thanks for the great kindness and sympathy shown to them by all in their great sorrow. – Newport, October 26th, 1898.

OBITUARY. – News has been received in Newport of the death, suddenly, in Ceylon, from heart failure, of Mr. Arthur W. Tilley, the only surviving son of the late Mr. B. W. Tilley, and of Mrs. Tilley, of Highfield, Castle Road. Deceased, who was a well-known member of the Rowing and Football Clubs in his younger days, served in the South African War, and afterwards obtained an appointment in a tea plantation in Ceylon. He served in the Great War on the Western Front, rising to a captaincy in the Rifle Brigade, and after the Armistice he returned to his work in Ceylon. He leaves a widow and two young children.
