SUDDEN DEATH OF MR. ARTHUR W. TILLEY.-We regret to record the sudden death, in Ceylon, on Saturday, of Mr. Arthur Wallington Tilley, second and only surviving son of the late Mr. B. W. Tilley and of Mrs. Tilley, of Highfield, Castle-road, news of which was received by cable this week. The deceased, who for some years held a responsible position in connection with a large tea plantation undertaking in Ceylon, was an old pupil of the Newport Grammar-school, and was formerly prominent in connection with local sport, having been an active member of the Rowing Club, and a very useful player of the Newport Football Club team. He served during the South African War in the Cape Mounted Rifles, and afterwards went to Ceylon. At the outbreak of the Great War he joined up immediately and received a commission in the Rifle Brigade, in which he held a captaincy. He took part in the fighting on the Western Front, and after the war he was married and returned to Ceylon. Deceased was looking forward to coming home on leave in the early summer, and in anticipation of this his wife and two little children had already arrived at her home in South Devon.
