NEWPORT.

THE REV. ALLAN WALLACE, M.A. – This gentleman, well known as the head master of the Newport Grammar School, died on Tuesday afternoon last, after an illness extending over about six weeks. Mr. Wallace's connection with the Grammar School commenced, we believe, about 30 years ago. He was then a young man, and came to the town with a high reputation as a scholar. By his death the Conservative party in Newport have lost a consistent supporter, who has often done them good service in past years; but while he was strong in his political convictions he never made an unnecessary parade of them, and had always a good-humoured method of dealing with opponents, and place himself on amicable terms with those on "the other side." Those who knew him best speak of him as having been a gentleman of the kindest disposition, and his death will be sincerely regretted by all who had the pleasure of his personal friendships.
