THE LATE MR. W.C. WALLER

The death occurred on Saturday of Mr. William Clarence Waller, of 27 Orchard Street, who had been in ill health for a number of years. A native of London, Mr. Waller took up residence here after serving in the Hampshire Regiment during the first world war. A cycle mechanic, he was employed at the Borough Hall Garage for 16 years and for 12 years by Messrs. F. Cheverton, Ltd. He worked for several years for Messrs. Rownson, Drew and Clydesdale, Ltd., as a warehouseman before retiring. At one time he was a member of the local Branch of the British Legion. He leaves a widow and two daughters.

The funeral service took place on Wednesday at the Pyle Street Methodist Church, when the Minister (the Rev. D. J. Creamer) officiated. The family mourners were Mrs. Waller (widow), Mr. and Mrs. A. Rose and Mr. and Mrs. D. Hayward (sons-in-law and daughters), Mr. W. Eldridge (brother-in-law), and Mesdames C. Tayler, and W. Riggen. Among the floral tributes were those from the Wayfarers, Carisbrooke, staff and pupils of the Priory Secondary Girls' School, and neighbours and friends of Orchard Street.

Interment was in Newport Cemetery. The funeral arrangements were made by Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son.
