#### DEATH OF MR. CHARLES ALLEN, OF SHIDE.

We HAVE TO RECORD THE DEATH OF Mr. Charles Allen, of Shide Villa, which took place yesterday (Friday). There were few better-known men in the Isle of Wight than the late Mr. Allen, his towering stature making him a conspicuous figure wherever he went. He was a keen sportsman, and some half century ago he was one of a band of young Islanders who made a great name as cricketers, and spread the fame of the Isle of Wight far beyond its borders. He was for many years high bailiff of the County Court, and though, so long as his health permitted, he always faithfully discharged the duties of his office, it was impossible to be long in his company without finding that his heart was set upon rural scenes and the good old English sports upon which he was wont to grow enthusiastically eloquent, and concerning which he had amassed a wealth of memories. Full of years Charles Allen has passed away. He had reached the great age of 83, and up to the last, in spite of symptoms of failing health, he bore himself as erect in body as he was upright in character. He was highly respected and will be much missed.
