FOUND DEAD IN BED. - On Wednesday morning, about 9 o'clock, Hannah Ashwin, aged 50, widow of a journeyman shoemaker, and domestic servant to Mrs. Starling, of High-street, outfitter, was found dead in bed. Deceased retired to bed in good health on Tuesday night, and Mrs. Starling becoming alarmed at being unable to rouse her by knocking at her door, which was locked as usual, sent for Superintendent Grapes, of the police. The door was then forced open, and deceased was found dead. It appeared that death had taken place from haemorrhage caused by the sudden rupture of a varicose vein, about 5 inches above the ancle[sic]. Appearances indicated that she had risen up in the bed to call for assistance, and fell back fainting from loss of blood. The cause of death was so manifest that a coroner's inquest was deemed unnecessary.
