THE LATE MR. F. BEACH. – The funeral of this respected townsman took place at the Newport Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. Dr. Burton officiating. In the absence through ill-health of the deceased's brothers, Mr. W. Beach, of High-street, Newport, and Mr. Philip Beach, of London, Mr. W. F. Beach, the deceased's nephew, was the chief mourner. Amongst those present were Messrs. Robey F. Eldridge, J.P., and W. C. Way, J.P. (exors.), J. R. Blake, Bevis (Ryde), F. Cowdery, W. Gubbins, F. Pittis, J.P., B. Midlane, T. Self, and J. B. Tucker, and Dr. Groves. The coffin, which was of polished oak, was covered with a number of handsome floral tributes to the memory of the deceased. Mr. W. F. Foster, J.P., was too unwell to attend. Mr. B. W. Tilley was the undertaker.
