**DEATH OF DR. HUTTON CASTLE** – We regret to record the death of the doyen of local medical men, Dr. Hutton Castle, which occurred yesterday (Friday) at his residence, 30 Carisbrooke-road, in his 81<sup>st</sup> year. The Doctor had been an invalid with a weak heart since he retired from practice in 1917. but he was able to get out until about a year ago. The end came peacefully, though rather unexpectedly. Dr. Castle was the son of Dr. Henry Castle, a former esteemed local doctor, to whose practice he succeeded about 55 years ago after an outstandingly creditable record during his training at St. Thomas's Hospital. He won high places in the examinations in his first and second years and, in the third year, the gold medal of the Physical Society. After taking his degree on M.B., London, he remained at the hospital for a while as assistant house surgeon, and later as house surgeon and resident accoucheur. For nearly 40 years he carried on his practice in Newport, and though his bluff manner might have led people to think otherwise, he was a man of deep sympathy and rare kindness of heart, as many poor people who have been his patients can testify. His first wife, who passed away in 1925, was Miss Conquest of Blackwater, and they had two children, a son (Dr. H.. Castle), who is now practising at Southampton, and a daughter, who became the wife of Capt. Gardner, of the Royal Army Service Corps, and died in 1927 while on her way home from Egypt. His second wife, who has been his devoted companion and nurse, was the widow of Dr. A. F. Reardon, a former medical officer at the I.W. County Mental Hospital. The Doctor's remains will be cremated at Stoneham, Southampton on Monday.
