NEWPORT.

Death of Mr. Edward Cave – A well known and universally respected citizen passed peacefully to his long rest on Wednesday in the person of Mr. Edward Cave, of the Newport Nurseries, whose death at the ripe aged of 83 has removed quite a landmark in the Island doings of the last century. The late Mr. Cave, who was born at Carisbrooke, entered as a young man Newport Nursery, the first nursery in the Island, under the late Mr. William Wilkins, a member of the Royal Horticultural Society, whose manager he became. In 1865, on the death of Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Cave became proprietor of the Newport Nursery, to the reputation of which he greatly added by his enterprise and abilities, particularly as a floriculturist and arboriculturist. Mr. Cave played a prominent part in the beautifying of the Island, as many private and public grounds were laid out and planted under his direction, including the grounds of the late Queen at Osborne and the Newport Cemetery,, where his remains will be laid to rest this (Saturday) afternoon. Much sympathy is felt with the aged widow and the family in their bereavement.
