Death of Mr. F. J. H. Daish. — We regret to announce the death at his home, West Dene, The Mall, on Friday week, of Mr. Frederick Joseph Harold Daish, who had been in business as a tailor and outfitter in the borough for more than 50 years. Mr. Daish, who was 74, was a member of an old island family, although he was born in Australia, when his father, the late Mr. Joseph Daish, was engaged in missionary work in that country. An excellent bowls player, Mr. Daish was captain and secretary of Newport Bowling Club for some years, and he had represented the county on many occasions. He was a member of the old Carisbrooke Club, whose green was at the Eight Bells Hotel. He was also an enthusiastic gardener, and one of the oldest members of the Newport Literary Society, where he was known as a first class bridge player. Mr. Daish, whose wife died 13 years ago, leaves four daughters and four sons, one of whom, Mr. S. Daish, is carrying on the business in Pyle-street. The funeral service took place at Quay-street Methodist Church on Tuesday, the Rev. G. J. Chamberlain officiating. The organist was Mrs. S. A. Porter. The principal mourners were Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Cousins, Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Miller, and Mr. and Mrs. R. H. Brimston (sons-in-law and daughters), Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Daish, Mr. and Mrs. S. Daish, Mr. and Mrs. L. R. Daish (sons and daughters-in-law), Mr. H. H. Daish (son), Mrs. G. Morgan (daughter), Mr. E. E. Daish (brother), and Mr. and Mrs. W. Guy (brother-in-law and sister-in-law). Owing to illness Mrs. H. H. Daish (daughter-in-law), Mr. G. Morgan (son-in-law), and Mr. P. A. Daish (brother) were unable to attend. Others present included Messrs G. Norman, C. H. Morgan, A. H. Cooke, and B.
