Hairdresser's Death.—The death occurred on Monday at 162 High-street, where he had carried on a hairdressing business for the last 12 years, of Mr. Frank Albert Elliott, aged 58. Mr. Elliott was a Leicestershire man, and served in his county regiment during the 1914-18 war. He came to the Island about 20 years ago. He was employed as a hairdresser at Albany Barracks before commencing business on his own account. He was very popular with his customers, and leaves a widow and two daughters, with whom sympathy is felt.
