**DEATH OF AN OLD RESIDENT.** – The death occurred on Thursday of last week at the residence of her son at Portsmouth of Mrs. Celia Fry, wife of Mr. Edward Fry, of 132 Pyle-street, a very respected inhabitant of the borough. The deceased, who was in her 78<sup>th</sup> year, had resided in Pyle-street throughout her married life of 49 year. Though a great suffer for years, she was of a cheerful disposition, and was known for her practical acts of kindness to those in trouble. She was a worker for the local corps of the Salvation Army, by whom she will be much missed. The funeral took place at Newport Cemetery on Wednesday, Adjutant Kent, of the Salvation Army, officiating. The hymn “On the sweet Eden shore” was sung. The chief mourners were Mr. E. Fry (husband), Messrs. George, Charles, William, Arthur, and Albert Fry (sons), Mrs. C. Hiscock (daughter), Mr. W. Dyer (brother), Mrs. Taylor (sister), Mrs. A. Fry and Mrs. M. Fry (daughters-in-law), and Mr. George Fry (nephew). Others present were Dr. Stanley Foster, Mrs. Saunders, Mrs. Wimbleton, and Mr. Diffey. There were a number of beautiful floral tributes.
