Originally joined up 14 October 1886, took pension 22 September 1908

Joined Royal Fleet Reserve Portsmouth 25 October 1908

Rejoined Royal Navy 2 August 1914, Invalided out 27 April 1916 (Disease of nervous system)

PATHETIC CIRCUMSTANCES – attended the death of Chief-Stoker P.O. Charles Pitman Fuller, son of Mrs. Fuller, of Roud House, St. John's-road, which took place at the County Asylum on Saturday last, at the age of 48. The deceased was a pensioner, but he patriotically joined up when the war started, and his mind became unhinged through the horrors he witnessed when on active service. The funeral took place at Newport Cemetery on Saturday. There were a number of beautiful wreaths, showing the esteem in which the gallant deceased was held. – Mrs. Fuller would like to take this opportunity of tendering sincere thanks to the medical superintendent and officials of the Asylum for their kindness and sympathy.
