### **NEWPORT**

DEATH OF MISS L. GRAPES. – The funeral took place on Wednesday morning of Miss Lucy Grapes, of 17 Terrace-road, daughter of the late Insp. Grapes, who was for years the chief officer of police in Newport. The deceased lady passed away on Saturday at the age of 72. A service was first held at St. Thomas's Church, the Rev. C.C. Sharpe officiating, the interment being made at Newport Cemetery. The mourners were: Mr. William Grapes (brother), Mrs. W. Grapes (sister-in-law), Miss Grapes (niece), Miss M. Cooper, Miss E.M. Noble, and Mr. F.W. Dudley. There were floral tributes from "Her affectionate niece and nephews, Hilda, Sydney, and Leslie"; "her loving cousin, Mary Warren"; Miss E.M.
