## Isle of Wight Observer – 7 January 1882

DEATH OF AN OCTOGENARIAN.- Another old inhabitant has departed from amongst us, in the person of the late Mr William Gubbings [sic], who died at his residence in Quay-street, on Thurs-day, last week, at the advanced age of 88 years. The subject of this brief notice was well known in the neighbourhood as a successful tradesman, and the evening of his earthly soujourn was spent in a manner befitting the decline of years. On Tuesday deceased was interred at Carisbrooke, when the curate of St Thomas's, the Rev Mr Yorke, conducted the burial ceremonial.
