DEATH OF MR. JOHN GUY. - The death took place on Sunday, after a short illness, of Mr. John Guy, head of the old-established engineering and wheelwright's business in Lower Pyle-street. Mr. Guy, who was only 53, was much esteemed by a large number of business acquaintances, including many farmers. He leaves a widow and family of seven children, for whom sincere sympathy is felt. Owing to unforeseen circumstances the funeral, fixed for Wednesday, had to be held on Tuesday, and consequently a number who would otherwise have attended were unable to do so. The Rev. J. Matthewman conducted a service at the house, and the interment followed at Newport Cemetery. The principal mourners were the widow, Messrs. A. J. and F. W. Guy (sons), the Misses E. and R. Guy (daughters), Mr. S. E. Leigh (brother-in-law), and Mesdames B. Pitman, A. Allen, B. Axhorn, and A. H. Leigh (sisters-in-law). Those also present included Mrs. A. Elderfield, Mrs. J. Matthewman, and Mr. R. Turner. There was a large number of floral tributes. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
