A well-deserved tribute of respect and esteem to the deceased was paid by the Rev. the Vicar at the Mayor's dinner, on the 9th instant, which we feel assured was appreciated by all who knew Mr. Hackett, as coming from one who had many opportunities, especially of late, of judging of his worth and the honesty of his heart. The good cause of Church and State has lost a true supporter in him, - one who never flinched in the fray, and who where principle was concerned, knew no compromise. He was ever ready to respond to the call of public charity and private necessity, and there are many in this island who will live to mourn the loss of a kind and liberal friend.
