OBITUARY. – The death of Mr. B. H. Hocking, aged 34, manager at Messrs. Mew Bros. china stores, Holyrood-street, occurred on Wednesday after a short illness due to the effects of war service. The deceased leaves a widow and two children, for whom much sympathy is felt. The deceased was a native of Ryde, and served for two years during the war as corporal in the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. He was for seven years in the employ of Messrs. Edward Morris, house furnishers, and was much esteemed in business circles. On coming to Newport he joined the local branch of the British Legion. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) at Newport Cemetery, the service being conducted by the Rev. D. Hendy Davies. The family mourners were Mr. and Mrs. Hosking (father and mother), Messrs. S. and E. Hosking (brothers), Miss R. Hosking (sister), Mr. and Mrs. Rogers (father and mother-in-law), Mr. G. Rogers (brother-in-law), and Mr. and Mrs. T. Truckel (sister and brother-in-law). The fellow employees of the deceased also attended, and the wreaths included those from the employees of Messrs. Mew Bros., at Newport, Ryde, and Shanklin, and the principals and staff of Messrs. Edward Morris. The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs. W. H. Bullock and Son.
