DEATH OF MR. MORRIS JACKMAN. – By the passing away of Mr. Morris Jackman, which we regretfully record, Newport loses a citizen whose genial presence has been familiar in its streets for a generation. For many years he carried on very successfully the business of a watchmaker and silversmith in Lower St. James's-street, and his name and personality in that connection were well-known in most parts of the Isle of Wight. He relinquished this business some years ago, and the later part of his life was spent in happy and comfortable retirement, the end coming very peacefully on Saturday last, at the age of 79 years. He had held various parochial offices and at the time of his death he was a member of the Newport Burial Board. He was also one of the oldest members of the Hand-in-Hand Friendly Society. In polities he was a stanch Liberal, but he held and expressed his views with studied moderation and unfailing courtesy. He took a great interest in many sports, cricket having especial charms for him. He was one of the most regular attendants at Newport matches, following the games with a keenness which never flagged, and while local patriotism was with him so strong a sentiment that he always longed to see Newport win, he bestowed his applause with true sportsmanlike impartiality whenever good play was exhibited, no matter by whom. His personal affability and kindness won for him the sincere regard of all with whom he came in contact and he leaves behind him a pleasant memory. The funeral took place on Wednesday afternoon at Newport Cemetery. Prior to the interment there was a short service at the house, attended by the family and a number of the Brethren, with whom the deceased was religiously associated. The service at the graveside was of a very impressive character, being conducted by Mr. A. James, who gave a touching address, after which the hymn "For ever with the Lord" was sung and the service concluded with prayer by Mr. C. Jackman, of Ryde, brother of the deceased. The principal mourners included Miss Jackman (daughter), Mr. and Mrs. Judd (sonin-law and daughter), Mr. and Mrs. Price (son-in-law and daughter), Messrs. A. and W. Jackman (sons), Mr. C. Jackman (brother), and Mr. G. B. Purkis, J.P. Six of the Brethren acted as bearers – Messrs. A. Caws, W. Tyler, C. Bull, F. Gustar, H. Kingswell, and P. Grist (Cowes). Other Brethren attending included Messrs. A. Cook, A. H. Stagg, T. E. Loosemore (Ventnor), G. Quinton, sen., G. Handley (Southsea), and Burrows (Wroxall). Amongst those also present were the Mayor, Mr. C. Salter, C.C. (secretary), and Mr. H. Harvey (trustee), representing the Hand-in-Hand Society; Ald. R. B. Cheverton, J.P., and Messrs. G. D. Rich, T.C., A. Millidge, and W. Weeks (clerk), representatives of the Newport Burial Board; Mr. C.T. Allee, Mr. F. W. B. Waterworth, and others. Mr. G. F. Quinton was undertaker.
