NEWPORT

SUDDEN DEATH IN THE STREET. — About half-past 3 on Thursday afternoon, Mr. John Kearley, 54, of Orchard-street, whilst out walking suddenly fell in High-street near St. Thomas's-square and expired. Dr. Coombs promptly attended and pronounced life extinct. Deceased, who was a bachelor, was formerly in business for himself as a pork butcher, after which he was employed as a journeyman butcher, but for some time past he had been out of work. He was stated to have got into a low and weak state, and to have suffered from pains in the head. The facts were communicated to the Coroner, who deemed an inquest unnecessary.

SUDDEN DEATH AT NEWPORT.

On Thursday, just before 4 o'clock, a painful event happened in the High Street, Newport. As a middle-aged man, named John Kearley, formerly a butcher carrying on business at Newport, was walking down the High Street, near Mr. Bishop's boot shop, he was observed to stagger and fall on the pavement. He was at once picked up and carried into the shop, where he expired before medical aid could be summoned. Drs. Waterworth and Coombs were sent for, but their only duty was to pronounce life extinct, death being attributed to heart disease. The poor fellow was afterwards removed to his sister's home in Pyle Street. The deceased was a native of Newport, and had seen better days. He was 54 years of age,
