COWES

TRAP ACCIDENT. – On Saturday afternoon Mr. W. Knight, a Newport Fruit salesman, was being driven on a light trolley along Beckford-road, when the horse turned sharply after making for the West Hill-road, with the result that the trolley tipped-up and Mr. Knight fell into the road, and the back of his head was badly cut. Mr. F.W. Compton and others went to his assistance and Dr. Denton quickly arrived and dressed the wound. Mr. Knight was then conveyed in his vehicle to the East Cowes Cottage Hospital, but at his own request he afterwards returned to Newport by train. He has since been seriously ill and was yesterday reported to be in a critical condition.

FATAL RESULT OF A COWES TRAP ACCIDENT.

The death occurred yesterday (Friday) afternoon of Mr. William Henry Knight, aged 58, fruit salesman of Seymour House, Fairlee-road, Newport, as the result of injuries sustained in a trap accident at Cowes on Saturday last. As reported under our Cowes heading on page 3 [reproduced above], deceased was accidentally thrown from a trolley which was being driven by another man, and received severe injuries to his head. He had been in failing health for some time, and in his already enfeebled condition he gradually sank and died as already stated. The facts have been reported to the Deputy Coroner, who will probably hold an inquest to-day (Saturday). Deceased will be remembered as having been in the employ of Mr. Charles King for many years prior to starting in business on his own account. Much sympathy is felt for the bereaved family.
